Notable dates in Masonic History;

1930: The oldest Masonic text known today, "The Halliwell Manuscript" or "Regius Poem" is said to have been written somewhere between 1390 and the beginning of the 15th century.

This text begins with a history of the Craft, starting with Euclid's invention of geometry in ancient Egypt.

The text, written in poetic form, is also the earliest Masonic manuscript containing charges.

The introduction of the manuscript is in fact followed by a section containing rules of conduct for a Master Mason, thus giving us an insight of the moral behavior expected by Masons at the time.
