Notable dates in Masonic History;

1656 (M)

John Aubrey begins writing A Natural History of Wiltshire in which he states that "the Fraternity of Free-Masons are known to one another by certain signs and watch words, and other significant words," and also described them as "adopted masons" and "accepted masons."



His history is not published until 1847.

John Aubrey FRS was an English antiquary, natural philosopher and writer. He is perhaps best known as the author of the Brief Lives, his collection of short biographical pieces.
