Notable dates in Masonic History;

1989

On October 14th, the Grand Lodge of Connecticut recognized the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Connecticut. This was the first U.S. recognition of Prince Hall Masonry that

remained in force, and led to similar actions by more than 2/3 of all U.S.

Grand Lodges.

Founded by Prince Hall on September 29, 1784 and composed Predominantly of African Americans.

Prior to the American Revolutionary War, Prince Hall and fourteen other free black men petitioned for admittance to the white Boston St. John's Lodge. They were declined. The Masonic fraternity was attractive to some free blacks like Prince Hall because freemasonry was founded upon ideals of liberty, equality and peace.
